Explanatory Note:

In a departure from past practice, the Governor did not specifically address the State Anticipated Resources section of the Appropriations Bill passed by the Legislature. Rather, on June 24,2011, prior to introduction of S-4000, the Governor signed a Revenue Certification that does not follow the detailed format of the Governor's Budget Message or the Appropriations Bill. As a result, it is not possible to display the detailed differences that may exist between S-4000 and the Governor's Certification. Accordingly, pages A1 and A2 display the anticipated revenue changes between the Governor's Budget Message and S-4000. Pages A3 and A4 display the Governor's Revenue Certification.
